All candidates are obliged to follow the admissions procedures included in Appendix No. 2 of the Resolution No. 124/2020-2024 of the Senate of the University of Opole - Terms of admission of candidates to the first year of studies in the academic year 2022/2023 and the scope of entrance examinations.

*Decision on entering on the list of students graduates of first-cycle programmes not listed in this appendix is made by the competent admissions committee. Candidates applying for these programmes should have passed at least 50% of the standards/learning outcomes applicable to the first cycle of the study field they wish to study, and admission should be preceded by a positive result of an interview. Courses required to complete the learning outcomes required for admission to the second cycle of full-time and part-time degree programmes, the so-called curriculum differences, are determined by the Dean of the Faculty after consultation with the course coordinator. Curriculum differences should constitute no more than 30 ECTS credits.

1.5-year second-cycle studies are intended for graduates of engineering studies.
